Background Information

Relevant provisions of the Act:

261 Disclosure of interests to the Minister

An Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member must give written notice to the Minister of all interests, pecuniary or otherwise, that the member has or acquires and that conflict or could conflict with the proper performance of the member's functions.

262 Disclosure of interests to Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee

- (1) An Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member who has an interest, pecuniary or otherwise, in a matter being considered or about to be considered by the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee must disclose the nature of the interest to a meeting of the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee.
- (2) The disclosure must be made as soon as possible after the relevant facts have come to the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member's knowledge.

- (3) The disclosure must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting of the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee.
- (4) <u>Unless the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee otherwise determines</u>, the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member:
 - (a) must not be present during any deliberation by the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee on the matter; and
 - (b) must not take part in any decision of the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee with respect to the matter.
- (5) For the purposes of making a determination under subsection (4), the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member:
 - (a) <u>must not be present</u> during any deliberation of the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee for the purpose of making the determination; and
 - (b) must not take part in making the determination.
- (6) A determination under subsection (4) must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting of the Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee.

263 Outside employment

An Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member must not engage in any paid employment that conflicts or may conflict with the proper performance of his or her duties.

Relevant provisions of Legislative Rule

113 Presiding at meetings

- (1) The Chair of the Committee must preside at all meetings.
- (2) However:
 - (a) if section 262 of the Act prevents the Chair from participating in the deliberations or decisions of the Committee with respect to a particular matter, the Committee may appoint an acting Chair from the members present to preside at the meeting concerned during any deliberation or decision with respect to that matter

An Emissions Reduction Assurance Committee member must not engage in any paid employment that conflicts or may conflict with the proper performance of his or her duties.
