I am emailing to update you on progress and timing of the legislation to implement the Treaty Between Australia and the Democratic republic of Timor-Leste Establishing Their Boundaries in the Timor Sea (the Treaty).

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing work to date – it's much appreciated.

We will shortly be seeking your input on the draft Explanatory Memorandum will need to be finalised by 13 November.

DIIS is working towards **introducing the Bill(s) in the week beginning 26 November**. Please see attached the most recent draft of the Bill(s), dated 25 October 2018. For agencies that have

outstanding responses to OPC questions, we encourage you to please finalise these as quickly as possible with OPC.

The expected key dates for the introduction of the Bill are:

- Wednesday 14 November (Senate sitting week):
 - The bill package (Bill, Explanatory Memorandum and Second Reading Speech) is settled
 - Minister Canavan is briefed by department on bill package, including letters to responsible Ministers and the PM (LAP approval/mop-up)
- Thursday 15 November (Senate sitting week):
 - Minister Canavan to sign the above letters to responsible Ministers and the PM
- Friday 23 November:
 - 11am deadline for Minister Canavan to approve legislative package
 - Approval from responsible Ministers for consequential amendments
 - PM LAP approval due (mop-up letter)
- Monday 26 November (sitting week):
 - Legislative package approved for introduction (LAP meeting)
- Tuesday 27 November (sitting week):
 - Legislative package to joint party room for clearance (Minister Canavan to lead)
- Wednesday 28 November (sitting week):
 - Bill introduced to Parliament

Subject: Update: Timor-Leste Treaty Implementation - Timelines for legislative process

Dear All,

As promised at the last IDC, I indicated that I would send you all updated timelines for the legislative process, including the deadline for the remaining outstanding drafting instructions and proposed dates for introduction in order for us to progress the implementation of the Treaty in 2018. As you are well aware, the Department of Industry, Innovation and Science (DIIS) is the lead agency responsible for coordinating the domestic implementation of the Treaty. We are also responsible for leading the Australian Government's consultations with Timor-Leste and affected petroleum companies on the transitional arrangements. To meet the government's public commitments to the government of Timor-Leste to ratify in 2018, DIIS has been working towards domestic implementation of the Treaty in 2018.

In terms of progress so far, since June we have been providing drafting instructions to the Office of Parliamentary Counsel (OPC) on the required changes to DIIS portfolio legislation. ^S

As you would be aware, with work still outstanding we have missed the opportunity to introduce legislation into Parliament during September, similarly we understand the week of 15 October will also be unachievable. That leaves the **week of 26 November** as our remaining opportunity for introduction this year, noting passage through both houses of Parliament will be difficult as this will be the final sitting period for the calendar year, which is always a busy period for Parliament. Therefore for the Bills to be passed in the final sitting period there will need to be a strong political will to prioritise passage of the legislation.

To meet the timeframe of introduction in 2018 the final date for provision of instructions to OPC is **28 September 2018**. DIIS will be in a position to progress the legislative package at this time (including the primary legislative amendments and consequential amendments received to date). As such we ask that remaining drafting instructions are provided to us **by 26 September 2018** to allow us the time to prepare and provide to OPC.
