## Background

This report details the investigation into the allegation that that \$37 has accessed departmental records and disclosed departmental information without authorisation, \$37

## **Investigation Outcome and Recommendations**

Furthermore, the CDPP's prosecution policy states 'A prosecution should not proceed if there is no reasonable prospect of a conviction being secured'.

## Purpose

To inform you of the outcome of the investigation criminal investigation undertaken on s47E(d) s22

### Outcome

The outcome of this investigation was the matter did not meet prosecution referral requirements.

The matter was not referred to the Commonwealth Director of Public Prosecutions due to insufficient evidence obtained during the course the investigation. s47E(d)

The Prosecution Policy of the Commonwealth states, 'a prosecution should not be instituted or continued unless there is admissible, substantial and reliable evidence that a criminal offence known to the law has been committed by the alleged offender.' <sup>1</sup>

When deciding to prosecute, 'a prosecution should not proceed if there is no reasonable prospect of a conviction being secured'.<sup>1</sup> While the decision of whether to proceed with a prosecution is with the CDPP, it is likely there is no reasonable prospect of conviction for this matter given insufficient evidence obtained to date.
