## ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/21

# Aluminium road wheels

## Exported from the People's Republic of China

### Termination of Accelerated Review of dumping and countervailing duty measures

### Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 19 December 2014 I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated an accelerated review of the dumping and countervailing duty measures applying to aluminium road wheels exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China in so far as they relate to INOVIT (Suqian) Corp Ltd. (Inovit).

A declaration under subsection 269ZH(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) was made to ensure securities in respect of interim dumping duty and countervailing duty that may be payable on exports by Inovit of aluminium road wheels were taken for the period of the review.

Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2015/06 was published to notify interested parties of the accelerated review and is available at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

#### Termination Grounds

During the accelerated review, Inovit failed to provide a complete response to the exporter questionnaire within an adequate timeframe.

I am satisfied that Inovit's failure to provide a substantially compliant response to the exporter questionnaire amounts to a refusal to co-operate with an aspect of the accelerated review and I have, for that reason, terminated the accelerated review in accordance with subsection 269ZE(3)(a) of the Act.

#### Effect of the termination of the accelerated review

Termination of this accelerated review means that securities taken on aluminium road wheels exported by Inovit and entered for home consumption in the period 19 December 2014 to 3 March 2015 (termination date)) will now be converted to interim dumping duty and countervailing duty.

The effective rates of duty are at the 'all other exporters' rate specified in the dumping duty and countervailing duty notices published by the Commission on 5

July 2012. Notice of the decision was published in ADN No 2012/33, which can be found on the Commission's website at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>. Future exports of certain aluminium extrusions by Inovit will also be subject to this duty rate.
