Background:

Ruukki Australia Pty Ltd (Ruukki) contacted the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) to discuss anti-dumping procedural questions and background information on behalf of Ruukki Metals Oy in Finland. A meeting was arranged in the Commission's Melbourne office.

Discussed:

- Ruukki provided a brief overview of its Australian operations.
- The Commission explained:
 - o the requirements for anti-dumping measures to be imposed;
 - the approach to calculating normal values; and
 - o situations whereby an investigation may be terminated.
- Ruukki provided brief commentary in regards to Consideration Report 234:
 - Ruukki outlined that some of the products exported to Australia may fall outside the goods description.
 - Ruukki flagged that there were potential differences between its production method and that of the Australian Industry.
 - Ruukki does not agree that alleged dumping is causing material injury to the Australian Industry.
 - o the Commission outlined that the findings in the Consideration Report 234 were based on information available during the consideration stage.
 - o the Commission outlined the process for lodging submissions.
- Ruukki was advised to contact the Commission to clarify any further matters in relation to this investigation.
- Ruukki stated that it intends to fully cooperate with the investigation and will lodge a submission in response to Bisalloy's application for anti-dumping duties.
