Purpose of visit:

The purpose of the meeting was for BlueScope Steel Limited (BlueScope) to provide the Commission with a better understanding of the impact of adding boron to galvanised steel.

Discussion:

- The Commission provided an update of the progress of the inquiry, including the extension to the SEF due date to 5 November 2015 which has recently been approved by the Parliamentary Secretary.
- The Commission sought BlueScope's advice regarding the impact of adding boron to galvanised steel and potential legitimate uses of alloyed galvanised steel.
- BlueScope advised that they will be making public submissions which will set out the content of their advice, suggested alterations to the original notice and suggested ways of managing legitimate exports. These submissions will be made in due course.
