# ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/02

### **Processed Dried Currants**

# **Exported from Greece**

#### Findings in relation to a Continuation Inquiry into Anti-Dumping Measures

#### Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

The Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) has completed its inquiry, into whether the expiration of the anti-dumping measures applying to processed dried currants (currants) exported to Australia from Greece would lead, or would be likely to lead to, a continuation of, or a recurrence of, the dumping and the material injury that the measures are intended to prevent.

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary) has considered the Commission's final findings and recommendations as detailed in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 213* (REP 213). The Parliamentary Secretary has accepted the Commission's recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all material findings of fact or law set out in REP 213.

Under subsection 269ZHG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) the Parliamentary Secretary has declared that he has decided to secure the continuation of the dumping duty notice currently applying to currants exported to Australia from Greece.

The notice continues in force after 14 January 2014.

Notice of the Parliamentary Secretary's decision was published in *The Australian* newspaper and the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on 13 January 2014.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (<u>www.adreviewpanel.gov.au</u>), in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of the publication in *The Australian.*
