## ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2013/102

## Prepared or preserved peach products

## Exported from South Africa

## **Termination of Investigation**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 10 July 2013 the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of prepared or preserved peach products exported to Australia from South Africa, following an application lodged by SPC Ardmona Operations Ltd.

The Commission published a notice in *The Australian* on 10 July 2013 notifying of the initiation of the investigation, and issued Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2013/54, which contains further details on the investigation, available at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

As a result of the Commission's investigation, the Anti-Dumping Commissioner (the Commissioner):

- is satisfied that, in relation to Langeberg & Ashton Foods Pty Ltd and Rhodes Food Group Pty Ltd, the goods exported by those exporters have been dumped, but the dumping margin is less than two per cent and, therefore, has decided to terminate the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(1) of the *Customs Act 1901 (the Act)* so far as it relates to those exporters; and
- is satisfied that the total volume of goods that have been exported to Australia over a reasonable examination period from South Africa that have been dumped from all other South African exporters is negligible and, therefore, has decided to terminate the investigation so far as it relates to South Africa in accordance with subsection 269TDA(3) of the Act.

In making the decision to terminate, the Commissioner had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) no. 216, submissions in response to that SEF, and other relevant information.

*Termination Report no.* 216, which sets out reasons for the termination decision, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decision is based, has been placed on the Commission's public record, available at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>. Alternatively, the public record may be examined at the Commission office by contacting the case manager on the details provided below.

A notice of the decision to terminate was published in *The Australian* newspaper on 13 December 2013.

The applicants may request a review of the Commissioner's decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of the public notice.
