

## **AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2013/12**

## 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic acid Exported from The People's Republic of China Finding in relation to a review of anti-dumping measures

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) has completed its review of the anti-dumping measures applying to 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4-D) exported to Australia from The People's Republic of China (China). The review commenced on 10 August 2012.

Customs and Border Protection reported its findings and recommendations to the Minister for Home Affairs (the Minister) in International Trade Remedies Branch Report No. 189B (REP 189B). The Minister has considered REP 189B and has accepted Customs and Border Protection's recommendations.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* newspaper and the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on 31 January 2013. The revised measures will apply to those goods exported from and entered for home consumption from the date of publication of the Minister's decision.

In that notice, under 269ZDB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), the Minister declared, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* to the extent that anti-dumping measures concerning the goods involved the publication of that notice that, with effect from the date of publication of that notice, the dumping duty notice is to be taken to have effect, in relation to exporters generally as if different variable factors had been fixed, relevant to the determination of duty.

The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review of measures are contained in REP 189B. To preserve confidentiality, details of the revised variable factors will not be published. Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the new rates from the Regional Dumping Officer in their respective capital city.
