



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/135

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Further extension of time granted to issue the Final Report for anti-circumvention inquiry to the Parliamentary Secretary

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 14 April 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an anti-circumvention inquiry in respect of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/31 which is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that a Final Report setting out the facts on which I base my recommendations would be submitted to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary) on or before 23 July 2014.

On 15 July 2014, the Parliamentary Secretary approved an extension to the deadline to submit the Final Report to 6 September 2014 due to the complexity of the issues surrounding the first anti-circumvention inquiry under Division 5A of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) (see ADN 2014/61). A second extension that revised the deadline to 24 October 2014 was approved by the Parliamentary Secretary on 28 August 2014 (see ADN 2014/83). A third extension that revised the deadline to 12 December 2014 was approved by Parliamentary Secretary on 22 October 2014 (see ADN 2014/111).

Following the previous extension, the Commission's assessment of legal and policy issues has identified a requirement to undertake additional work in this first anti-circumvention inquiry undertaken by the Commission. I have therefore requested, pursuant to subsection 269ZHI(1)(ec) of the Act, a final further extension of the deadline for submission of the Final Report to the Parliamentary Secretary.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, as a result of that request, extended the deadline for submission of the Final Report to **23 December 2014**. The Parliamentary Secretary's decision for this inquiry is now due on or before **22 January 2015**, unless extended.
