

## ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/104

#### **Certain Aluminum Extrusions**

### **Exported from the People's Republic of China**

# Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 12 June 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/46. This ADN is available on the internet at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 1 October 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary).

#### Due to:

- the need to conduct verification visits to several overseas exporters; and
- the complexity in assessing the claims, in circumstances where interested parties have not provided sufficient information regarding the claims;

I requested an extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 30 December 2014. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 13 February 2015.
