



INVESTIGATION INTO ALLEGED DUMPING OF CERTAIN CRYSTALLINE SILICON PHOTOVOLTAIC MODULES OR PANELS EXPORTED FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

NOTE FOR FILE – RESPONSES TO IMPORTER QUESTIONNAIRE

Background

On 14 May 2014, the date of initiation of the above investigation, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) contacted and provided importer questionnaire to the selected nine importers of certain crystalline silicon photovoltaic modules or panels (PV modules or panels (the goods)) exported from China. These importers are considered to be the largest importers of the goods by volume, and the Commission requested their participation in the investigation by completion of the questionnaire. The importer questionnaire and spread sheet were also placed on the Commission's website on 14 May 2014 for all other importers who wanted to voluntarily provide the information.

The questionnaire sought the following information;

- supplier details;
- imported goods (including cost to import and sell);
- forward orders; and
- Australian sales.

The due date for responses to the Questionnaire was 28 May 2014. Some Importers requested and the Commission granted an extension to complete responses to the importer questionnaire.

Responses received

As of 11 June 2014, the Commission has received complete response to the Importer Questionnaire from the following six selected importers:

- Trina Solar Australia
- Renesola Australia Pty Ltd
- Solar Juice Pty Ltd
- Solargain PV Pty Ltd
- R F Industries Pty Ltd

The Commission may seek to visit these importers to conduct verification of information provided in their responses to the Importer Questionnaire.
