

ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2013/104

Zinc coated (galvanised) steel and Aluminium zinc coated steel

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Statement of Essential Facts to be published as soon as practicable

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 4 October 2013 the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the resumption of investigations into the alleged subsidisation of zinc coated (galvanised) steel and aluminium zinc coated steel exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) by Angang Steel Company Limited (ANSTEEL).

The notice advised that the Commission intended to place a statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation on the public record by 10 December 2013. The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base its recommendations to the Minister for Industry (the Minister).

Subsection 269ZZT(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* states that as soon as practicable after the reviewable decision has been revoked, the SEF must be published. Following the publication of the SEF, the normal investigation timeframes apply. Interested parties will have 20 days within which to make submissions in response to the SEF. The Commission will then have a further 25 days to provide a report to the Minister for Industry.

The Commission will delay the SEF, which was due to be published on 10 December 2013 and instead publish the SEF as soon as practicable.
