These facts when compared with the Commissions own "normal value" figures as noted in Table 9 of the Consideration Report 234 of 8th January 2014 (page 27) (copied herebelow) confirm CMC's sales prices are well in excess of these normal values, therefore it is difficult to see how material injury can have occurred :
