### **Background:**

OneSteel Manufacturing Pty Ltd (OneSteel) contacted the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) and requested a meeting. The primary purpose of the meeting was to discuss OneSteel's responses to exporter verification reports published by the Commission. OneSteel sought to underpin its recent written submissions by seeking to meet with the Commission. A meeting was arranged at the ADC premises in Melbourne.

### Discussed:

The Commission explained the investigation and submissions process to OneSteel, including the timing and consideration of lodging a submission, both before and after the publication of the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF). OneSteel summarised their concerns relating to:

The Commission advised that the issue of like goods, comparable subset for normal value determination and due allowances would be detailed in the SEF. The Commission also advised OneSteel to lodge a submission on the due allowance adjustment issue relating to tolerance differences.
