**INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING AND SUBSIDISATION OF
HOT ROLLED PLATE STEEL
EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA
FROM THE PEOPLES REPUBLIC OF CHINA**

I am writing to advise that the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) has not received an exporter questionnaire response from Jingyin Xingcheng Special Steel Works Co., Ltd (Jingyin Xingcheng) by the due date, 21 March 2013.

As outlined in our email to you on 20 March 2013, the information you submitted on 18 March 2013 was in respect of the wrong questionnaire. In this correspondence Customs and Border Protection provided electronic links to the correct exporter questionnaire for your company to complete. To date we have not received a response from Jingyin Xingcheng.

I am therefore satisfied that sufficient information has not been furnished to enable export prices and normal values to be determined, and regard Jingyin Xingcheng to be a non-cooperative exporter in the investigation. As a result I am disregarding the information provided and instead will rely on all other relevant information available to me in making my findings and recommendations.

Jingyin Xingcheng can still participate in the investigation by providing Customs and Border Protection with submissions relating to injury and causation and providing comment in relation to the findings and recommendations in the statement of essential facts.
