ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2017/16

Certain resealable can end closures

Exported from India

Termination of Investigation

Public notice under subsection 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 18 May 2016, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of certain resealable can end closures (referred to as tagger, ring and foil (TRF) ends, or TRFs) (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of India (India), Malaysia, the Republic of the Philippines (the Philippines) and the Republic of Singapore (Singapore), following an application lodged by Marpac Pty Ltd under subsection 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of my decision not to reject the application and to initiate the investigation (initiation notice) was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (the Commission) website on 18 May 2016 (Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2016/54 refers). The ADN is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

As a result of the Commission's investigation, I am satisfied that:

- the goods exported from India by Hindustan Tin Works Ltd. (Hindustan) were not dumped and therefore I have terminated the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) so far as it relates to this exporter; and
- in relation to all other exporters of the goods from India, the total volume of goods that have been dumped is negligible and therefore I have terminated the investigation, in accordance with subsection 269TDA(3) of the Act in so far as it relates to this country.

In making the decision to terminate part of this investigation, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties concerning the publication of the initiation notice, *Statement of Essential Facts* (SEF) No.350, Hindustan's submissions in response to that SEF and other relevant information.

Termination Report (TER) No. 350, which sets out reasons for the termination decisions, including the material findings of fact and law upon which the decisions are based, has been placed on the Commission's public record at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The applicant may request a review of these decisions to terminate part of the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days after the first publication of this public notice.
