**LATE SUBMISSION FROM DRAKE TRAILERS PTY LTD**

On 13 October 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission received a submission from Drake Trailers Pty Ltd (Drake Trailers).

The Commission's final report for the investigation is due to be provided to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (Parliamentary Secretary) on or before 27 October 2014.

Section 269TEA(4) of the *Customs Act 1901* states that the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) is not obliged to have regard to any submission made in response to the statement of essential facts (SEF) that is received more than 20 days after publication of the SEF, if to do so would, in the Commissioner's opinion, prevent the timely preparation of the final report to the Parliamentary Secretary.

In accordance with this provision and given the imminent due date of the final report, the Commissioner will not have regard to this submission, as to do so would prevent the timely preparation of the final report to the Parliamentary Secretary.

Drake Trailers were advised of this decision on 15 October 2014. The Commission will consider Drake Trailers' submission as an exemption enquiry should dumping duties be imposed by the Parliamentary Secretary.
