*Notice under subsection 269ZHB(1) of the Customs Act 1901*

**Pineapple Fruit – Consumer and  
Pineapple – Food Service Industrial  
Exported from the Kingdom of Thailand and  
the Republic of the Philippines  
Expiry of Anti-Dumping Measures**

I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, in accordance with subsection 269ZHB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), advise that the anti-dumping measures on pineapple fruit – consumer and pineapple – food service industrial (FSI) exported to Australia from The Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand) (except for pineapple fruit – FSI exported by Malee Sampran Public Co and pineapple fruit – consumer exported by Thai Pineapple Canning Industry Corp Ltd) and The Republic of the Philippines (the Philippines) are due to expire.

The anti-dumping measures on pineapple fruit – consumer exported from Thailand (except by Thai Pineapple Canning Industry Corp Ltd) are due to expire on 14 October 2016. The anti-dumping measures were continued for a further five years from 14 October 2011 by the then Minister for Home Affairs following consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 171D (REP 171D).

The anti-dumping measures on pineapple fruit – FSI exported from Thailand (except by Malee Sampran Public Co) are due to expire on 14 October 2016. The anti-dumping measures were continued for a further five years from 14 October 2011 by the then Minister for Home Affairs following consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 171C (REP 171C).

The anti-dumping measures on pineapple fruit – consumer exported from the Philippines are due to expire on 29 September 2016. The anti-dumping measures were continued for a further five years from 29 September 2011 by the then Minister for Home Affairs following consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 171B (REP 171B).

The anti-dumping measures on pineapple fruit – FSI exported from the Philippines are due to expire on 29 September 2016. The anti-dumping measures were continued for a further five years from 29 September 2011 by the then Minister for Home Affairs following consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 171A (REP 171A).

Those persons as specified at subsection 269ZHB(1)(b) of the Act are invited to apply for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures. The application must be in writing, be in an approved form, contain such information that the form requires and be signed in the manner indicated in the form. Applications must be lodged by 1 February 2016.

The application must provide evidence addressing whether there appear to be reasonable grounds for asserting that the expiration of the anti-dumping measures to which the application relates might lead, or might be likely to lead, to a continuation of, or a recurrence of, the material injury that the measures are intended to prevent.

If an application is received that complies with the prescribed requirements and I decide not to reject that application, I will undertake an inquiry and I will report to the Assistant Minister for Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary)<sup>1</sup> within 155 days (or by such later date as the Parliamentary Secretary may allow in accordance with subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act). I will publish a notice on the Anti-Dumping Commission's website advising the commencement of such an inquiry.

If no application is received within the period specified above, the anti-dumping measures applying to:

- pineapple fruit – consumer exported from Thailand (except by Thai Pineapple Canning Industry Corp Ltd) will expire on 14 October 2016. Therefore, on and from 15 October 2016 anti-dumping measures would no longer apply.
- pineapple fruit – FSI exported from Thailand (except by Malee Sampran Public Co) will expire on 14 October 2016. Therefore, on and from 15 October 2016 anti-dumping measures would no longer apply.
- pineapple fruit – consumer exported from the Philippines will expire on 29 September 2016. Therefore, on and from 30 September 2016 anti-dumping measures would no longer apply.
- pineapple fruit – FSI exported from the Philippines will expire on 29 September 2016. Therefore, on and from 30 September 2016 anti-dumping measures would no longer apply.
