INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF SOLID BASE ANGLE EXPORTED FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

On 26 February 2019, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of solid base angle exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2019/26. 1

The initiation notice advised that responses to the exporter questionnaire for the investigation are required by 4 April 2019. The Commission received requests for extensions of time to the due date from certain exporters within the legislated period.

Due consideration has been given to the extension requests by the General Manager of the Commission, having regard to the exporters' individual circumstances and the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015.* ²

The following table summarises the extensions of time given to individual exporters and provides a summary of the revised due dates where applicable.
