

AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2012/61

Release of confidential dumping and countervailing information

The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) publishes details of all commodities subject to dumping/countervailing measures in the Dumping Commodity Register (DCR). The DCR includes all non-confidential dumping/countervailing information required by customs brokers/importers to lodge an entry for goods subject to dumping/countervailing measures.

The DCR does not contain the confidential information for any dumping/countervailing measures, such as the applicable variable factors (ascertained export prices, normal values and/or non-injurious prices) or the dumping/countervailing security or interim duty rates.

Portions of the confidential information may be provided to **bona fide importers** of goods from an exporter/supplier in a country subject to dumping and/or countervailing measures.

The onus is on the importer to prove their bona fides by providing evidence of either:

- a previous trading history with a nominated exporter/supplier of the goods from a country subject to dumping/countervailing measures. Evidence of a trading history would take the form of at least <u>commercial invoices</u>, <u>packing list and bills of lading</u> from previous shipments. Customs and Border Protection may also request additional documentation as proof of an importer's bona fides; or
- in the absence of a trading history, an <u>offer</u> or a <u>quotation</u> from an exporter/supplier of goods subject to dumping/countervailing measures. The offer or quotation must be on the exporter/supplier's company letterhead emails will not generally be accepted.

Importers should note that only as much of the confidential information as is necessary to enter the goods will be provided by Customs and Border Protection.
