## **AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO.2012/47**

### **Regulation changes to Schedule 1B of the *Customs Regulations 1926***

Cape Verde, Montenegro, Russia, Samoa, Saudi Arabia, Tonga and Ukraine have recently acceded to the World Trade Organization (WTO) and are now formal members.

Changes to Schedule 1B of the *Customs Regulations 1926* (the Customs Regulations) were required so that the “economy in transition” provisions contained in Part XVB of the *Customs Act 1901* do not apply (for anti-dumping purposes) to these countries.

Two amending regulations have been enacted to include those countries on Schedule 1B of the Customs Regulations.

- Customs Amendment Regulation 2012 (No. 6) added Cape Verde, Montenegro, Samoa, Saudi Arabia, Tonga and Ukraine to Schedule 1B. It has been enacted and was effective on and from 3 August 2012.
- Customs Amendment Regulation 2012 (No. 7) added Russia to Schedule 1B. It has been enacted and was effective on and from 28 September 2012.

As a result, these countries will no longer be treated as economies in transition for anti-dumping purposes by the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service from the dates specified above.
