Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from the Kingdom of Thailand

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of the decision by the former Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation to vary the variable factors in respect of the dumping duty notice applying to Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from the Kingdom of Thailand (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (ADC) website on 27 June 2018 (<u>ADN</u> 2018/88).

An application for review was made by Austube Mills Pty Ltd.

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the Reviewable Decision.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, Minister for Industry, Science and Technology have considered and accepted the recommendations, and reasons for the recommendations, made by the ADRP in ADRP Report No 93, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No 93.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901*, I **affirm** the Reviewable Decision.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
