Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Certain Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) Flat Electrical Cables exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) has completed its reconsideration of a review of a decision which I, ED HUSIC, Minister for Industry and Science made under subsection 269TG(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of PVC Flat Electrical Cables exported from the People's Republic of China by Guilin International Wire and Cable Co. Ltd (Guilin) and its related party entities (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 1 September 2022 (ADN 2022/019).

An application for review of the Reviewable Decision was made by Electra Cables (Aust) Pty Ltd (Electra) on 4 October 2022. A copy of the application is available on the Review Panel website at <u>www.adreviewpanel.gov.au</u>. Review No. 160 was initiated on 22 November 2022 and the Review Panel made its report to me on 19 January 2023.

On 20 February 2023, I accepted the recommendation of the Review Panel in Report No. 160 and affirmed the Reviewable Decision. On 22 March 2023, Electra applied for judicial review of that decision. On 11 January 2024, the Federal Court of Australia made orders setting aside the decision and Report No. 160. The matter was remitted to the Review Panel for reconsideration in accordance with law.

On 30 August 2024, the Review Panel made its report to me following its reconsideration in accordance with law (Report No. 160A). A copy of this report is available on the Review Panel website. Any confidential information contained in Report No. 160A has been removed from the version available on the website. If your confidential information forms part of Report No. 160A, you can request a copy of the report containing your confidential information from the Review Panel Secretariat via the details available on the Review Panel website.

The Review Panel has recommended that the Reviewable Decision be **affirmed**.

I, ED HUSIC, Minister for Industry and Science, have considered and accepted the recommendations, and reasons for the recommendations, made by the Review Panel in Report No. 160A, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in Report No. 160A.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1)(a) of the Act, I **affirm** the Reviewable Decision. The Reviewable Decision is to have effect from the date the Reviewable Decision was set to take effect.

Applications for review of this decision under the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review)* Act 1977 should be made to the Federal Court of Australia within 28 days of:

• The publication of this notice and Report No. 160A; or

• If the public version of Report No. 160A contains any redactions to remove your confidential information, such later date on which you receive a copy of Report No. 160A without your confidential information redacted.
