Description: Callide Wind Farm is located in the Calliope Range, approximately 75 km south-west of Gladstone and 29 km north-east of Biloela in the Banana Shire Council LGA. The project is co-developed by Iberdrola and DP Green Energy under a joint development agreement. The state planning approval was granted on 20 September 2023 by SARA. The approval includes construction and operation of up to 70 wind turbines, 275/33kV site substation, battery energy storage system, 275kV switchyard, 275kV export lines, 33kV reticulation network, internal roads and hardstands, meteorological masts, and ancillary infrastructure including temporary construction compounds, batch plant, laydown areas and permanent operations and maintenance facilities. The project will be constructed under a multi-contract structure, consisting of the following major work packages: 1. Wind Turbine Supply and Installation including inland transportation and public roads upgrade works; 2. Wind Farm Balance of Plant; 3. Generator Connection and Access Agreement for construction of 275kV switchyard and export lines and provision of associated transmission services, and; 4. Owners Engineer services (no subcontracting); In addition, the project intends to enter into a Services Agreement with Wind Turbine OEM for the operation and maintenance of the wind farm. Awarding of above five work packages is expected in September 2024. Bidding has commenced through a formal and competitive tendering process except for Owners Engineer which is planned for tender to start in Q4 2024. Bids will be evaluated against health, safety & environment performance, technical compliance, commercial compliance and costs. Procurement of goods & services is expected to commence from Q4 2024 following contract award and completion of design activities. Parties awarded for work packages 1, 2, 3 and the Services Agreement listed above will become the procurement entities and will be contractually required to comply with the AIP Plan.
