- All suppliers, upon appointment, will enter into a binding commercial agreement with COS confirming agreement with COS Best Practice standards including COS' Ethical Sourcing Policy.
- COS encourages suppliers and sub-contractors to develop their capabilities by providing feedback on Contract performance. COS will also provide feedback to unsuccessful suppliers on how to improve performance in future tenders.
