Name: Jimblebar Beneficiation Project

Location: Jimblebar, Western Australia

Type: Mine or quarry

Purpose: Upgrade existing facility

Capital expenditure: \$500 million - \$1 billion

Description: The scope of the Jimblebar Beneficiation Project (Project) is to construct a new beneficiation plant downstream of the existing Jimblebar Ore Handling Plant. Modifications and tie-into existing processing infrastructure, tailings management infrastructure and non-process infrastructure will be required to support the operation of the plant. The Project is currently in Selection Phase Study (SPS) (ie. Pre-feasibility) and is forecasting to proceed to Definition Phase Study (DPS) (ie. Feasibility) from June 2022. The SPS objective is to optimise the preferred investment alternative in line with the Proponent's major capital investment guidelines. The Proponent has selected an Engineering, Procurement and Construction Management Services (EPCM) delivery model for the Project. Tendering Plan–EPCM Services The Proponent has advertised an Expression of Interest (EOI) for EPCM services via the Industry Capability Network (ICN) on 2 July 2021. The EPCM tender pack will be issued to the shortlisted vendors in September 2021 and the contract is due to be awarded in June 2022. Please note that tendering of the EPCM contract is due to a email on 17 May 2021. Tendering Plan – Construction Services The Proponent also wishes to tender an Early Contractor Involvement (ECI) package for Structural, Mechanical, Piping, Electrical and Instrumentation (SMPEI) services in order to support Definition Phase engineering of the beneficiation plant. This tender pack is due to be released in 01 CY 2022.
