DESCRIPTION OF PATTERN

The pattern is of a modification of a vehicle-mounted flowmeter as approved in Victorian Notice of Approval No 422. The modification consists of installing the flowmeter in a fixed location, and having the pump driven by an electric motor. The maximum flow rate is 30 gallons per minute.

DESCRIPTION OF VARIANT

1. With any pump driven by any type of prime mover, provided the maximum flow rate is 30 gallons per minute.
